Description

Updated from a version of pfSense from early today to the latest version (2.0-BETA5 (i386) built on Wed Jan 26 10:45:46 EST 2011) and my CA tab is now blank with the internal CA missing. All certificates are now listed as *External* issuer where they had previously listed the internal CA.

Restoring from a backup config taken just before the upgrade put the internal CA back and things are once again working as expected.
