Description

This may apply to more than Office365 mail, but it does impact this mail system for sure. Details (and the fix) are at this link <https://forum.pfsense.org/index.php?topic=72015.new.topicseen#new>.

The issue overall is allowing support for email systems that require SMTP Authentication using LOGIN, not PLAIN (as is the default / hard coded now). Perhaps just add a pull-down, to select LOGIN or PLAIN, and then apply this?
